We have already had a very busy start to the term, and the focus for reading is once again really taking off, aided by our new Reading bus. The children love it!

We are also elevating the importance of spelling accuracy and widening our children's vocabulary understanding, and we will be sharing with you how you can support your child with these priorities at home. Competent reading supports learning in all areas of the curriculum, including mathematical reading and problem solving. It also supports our children beyond primary school.

SCHOOL ADMISSIONS – SEPTEMBER 2020

PRIMARY APPLICATIONS

If your child was born between **1st September 2015** and **31st August 2016**, you must apply for a Primary School Reception place for September 2020.

(Applications are required for all children with a 4th birthday between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2020).

SECONDARY APPLICATIONS

If your child is in the final year of primary education (Year 6), you must apply for a Secondary School Year 7 place for September 2020.

(Applications are required for all children who are in their final year at a primary school).
