School Admissions—September 2020

Primary Applications: If your child was born between 1st September 2015 and 31st August 2016 you must apply for a Primary School Reception place for September 2020.

(Applications are required for all children with a 4th birthday between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2020).

Secondary Applications: If your child is in the final year of primary education (Year 6) you must apply for a Secondary Year 7 place for September 2020.

(Applications are required for all children who are in their final year at primary school).

Masses and Prayer & Liturgies

Our year group masses for KS2 children are well under way - look out for a text message to let you know when it is your child's year group. Masses are always on Wednesdays at 9:15am in church and we warmly welcome you to join us. These experiences enable the children to become familiar with 'the mass' as they take part in the preparations with their class teacher. For children in Key Stage 1, Father Janusz visits school and engages in a shared reading of the Gospel of the Day and discusses its

meaning with the children. In the Foundation Stage, children have the opportunity to explore articles of religious significance such as the cross and rosary beads.

Once again, on the 18th October, we will be celebrating praying the rosary with thousands of others across the world. This takes place in school and has been an extremely successful meditation in previous years. **Please send your child to school with rosary beads** so that they can actively join in and celebrate this special day.

We are very proud to be setting up our own KS2 group of 'Mini Vinnies'; a group whose members are currently being chosen by the children. The Society of St Vincent de Paul has been engaging with young people and education since its earliest days. Today the SVP England & Wales is pleased to highlight its continuing strong links with young people, through the development of its new 'Mini Vinnies' programme - a ground-breaking Primary Schools initiative, based on good work done in Australia, piloted in the Diocese of Shrewsbury, and which is seen as having, "the potential to significantly contribute to the future of our Society."

'Mini Vinnies' are children aged between 7 to 11 (or younger) who are encouraged to embark on their first steps as possible 'Vincentians for life'. As Mini Vinnies, the youngsters have their own 'treasured' Prayer, Pledge and Badge, a dedicated website and a range of bright and colourful documents which guide them in their formative steps - helping and enabling them to become in every sense, young Vincentians - or 'Mini Vinnies'.
