Maths

This term we will look at a variety of maths topics including, place value, geometry, fractions, addition and subtraction and multiplication and division. The children will learn to be able to partition numbers, identify and describe the properties of 2D and 3D shapes, to identify equivalent fractions and to calculate questions and solve problems using formal methods.

In Class 6 we will also be working hard to learn our multiplication and division tables. This half term we will continue to focus on our 3- and 4-times tables. However, we will keep recapping the 2,5 and 10-time's tables too.

R.E

In Class 6 we explore the following RE topics:

Journeys – The Christian family's journey with Jesus through the Church's year.

Listening and Sharing – Listening to the Word of God and sharing Holy Communion.

The children will be encouraged to lead daily prayers and liturgical prayer. We will start the year by beginning our own class prayer book.

Please refer to the R.E. newsletter for more information. Class 6's class saint is St John Paul II and across the year we will be learning about how important he is to the church's teaching.

In RSE, we will explore topics and themes such as Sharing online Chatting online (and peer on peer – cyberbullying) and how we can ensure we are safe in our bodies.

English

Our main focus in English will be linked to our main topic and key texts. We will be studying the features of each genre and using them to develop our own writing skills.

We will explore a range of genres and books, beginning with to The Edge of the World for adventure stories and The Rhythm of the Rain for explanation texts and a recount.

There will continue to be a large emphasis on accuracy in punctuation and use of correct grammar in all written work. It is also important that handwriting is well formed and accurate.

Spellings: Your child will be given weekly spellings which they can practise at home using the look, write check method. It is also useful to apply their spellings to sentences.

Reading: MyOn & Renaissance: Every child has a login for MyOn and Renaissance, where they have been allocated books that match their reading ability. Once they have completed a book, they can then complete the comprehension quiz and gain points! We use MyOn in addition to the reading books they are allocated in school.

Geography— The journey of a river

In geography, we will be learning all about the journey of a river. We will begin by locating and identifying key river on a global, national and local scale. We will then gain understanding of the three stages of a river and how they differ as well as describing river characteristics and processes.

The Learn It, Link It topic information sheet can be found in your child's homework book.

History – The Stone Age to Ice Age

The children will explore life and some of the achievements from each of the three ages and will begin to recognise connections, contrasts and trends over time. The children will also be able to use appropriate historical language and place events on a timeline detailing the shift from the Stone age.

The Learn It, Link It topic information sheet can be found in your child's homework book.

Science – Forces and Magnets and Plants

This term in science we will learn all about forces and magnets. Within this topic the children will understand what a force is and that some forces require contact, but magnetic forces do not. The children will know that magnets have two poles – North and South and that the poles direction will attract or repel something. In the plants topic, the children will identify and describe the functions of different parts of the flowering plant and use observations to describe how seeds and bulbs grow.

Other Curriculum Areas:

PE: In PE, the children will learn numerous gymnastic moves and will put them into a sequence. Then, in net and wall the children will explore a variety of sports with the aim of sending a ball towards a target area to be defended by an opponent.

Music: In music, we will look at music from South America and use the story of Chinese New Year to perform pentatonic melodies.

Computing: We will use Purple Mash for Computing and continue to develop our computing skills.

MFL: In Spanish, we will look at basic descriptions of ourselves – such as our hair and eye colour.


Art & DT: In Art we will study the work of Julie Opie and create river collages. In DT we will use a range of techniques to cook a main dish.

Polite Reminders

Children need to bring their reading records, reading books and spelling books into school every day. Please continue to encourage your child to read daily and sign their records with any comments of praise and areas for development.

Class 6 need to wear their PE kit on Mondays and Wednesdays – this should be a plain navy-blue tracksuit/shorts with a plain white t-shirt.
