Maths

This term there will be a strong focus on methods for multiplication and division. The children will be using formal methods to solve problems by multiplying or dividing. We will then move on to fractions, decimals and percentages and converting between these.

R.E

We will begin the Spring term by learning about our 'Mission' within our Church community. We will explore how Christians fulfil their mission in different ways. The children will then move onto the topic of 'Memorial Sacrifice' during which we will be learning about relating to others through the Eucharist. We will then move onto our Lentern topic of 'Sacrifice.'

RSE

In RSE/PSHE lessons we will be learning about themes such as lifestyle choices, cyberbullying and forms of abuse.

English

Our first focus in English will be fantasy stories linked to the text, 'Clockwork.' We will be studying the features of this genre and using the features to develop our own writing skills. We will then focus on poetry as we will be studying the poem – 'I wandered Lonely as a Cloud.'

This term we will continue to refine our writing in both fiction and non-fiction. Other genres we will cover include recounts, balanced argument, diary entry, newspaper report and adventure stories which we will link to a range of exciting books or topics.

There will continue to be a strong emphasis on accuracy in punctuation and use of correct grammar in all written work. It is also important that handwriting is well formed and accurate which we will practise regularly. Please also find time to enjoy reading with your child at home and record this in your child's reading record.

Spellings: Your child will be given weekly spellings which they can practise at home using the look, write check method. It is also useful to apply their spellings to sentences.

Reading – MyOn & Renaissance: Every child has a login for MyOn and Renaissance, where they have been allocated books that match their reading ability. Once they have completed a book, they can then complete the comprehension quiz and gain points! We use MyOn in addition to the reading books they are allocated in school.

History – The Home Front

This unit aims to teach pupils about the problems of living on the British Home Front of WWII. Pupils will learn about the concept of 'Total War' fought in WWII by the Nazis and how this forced the whole British population to work together to defeat Hitler.

Science – Living things and their Habitats

The children be learning how to explain life cycles of a mammal, amphibian, insect and bird and the differences between them. They will also use their prior knowledge of plants to explain the reproduction process.

Later in the term, we will also be looking at magnets, forces and materials.

Geography – Climate Change is Real

During the first half term, our topic will be 'Climate Change is Real.' The children will be learning about how our climate is changing and the consequences of this for our planet.

Other Curriculum Areas:

PE: For the first half term the focus will be on gymnastics, and the second half term focus will be net and wall. Class 9 PE will be on a Monday with Miss Kelly and on a Wednesday with Mr Gandy.

Music: In music, the children will focus music from south and West Africa and then Holi Festival.

Computing: We will use Purple Mash for Computing and we will begin with databases, games creator and modelling.

MFL: We will have weekly Spanish lessons where we will learn about vegetables and going to the doctor.

Art & DT: In Art we will be learning about Henry Moore and in DT we will be planning and preparing a meal.


Polite Reminders
