

ENRICHMENT PASSPORT

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We are passionate at St. Joseph's about creating a rich set of experiences for all our children, that will help them to write the chapters of their life story. It is important that children have the opportunity to try things out, to get a taste of the world around them; to see things they wouldn't normally see, to go to places they wouldn't normally go, and meet people they wouldn't normally meet. We develop our character from taking on challenges, pursuing our interests and by doing things that are worth doing, even when they get difficult.

Our aim is that this passport will challenge our pupils to learn outside of the classroom and encourage home, school and community discussions. Partnerships are important when helping our pupils to develop their character through experiences. School can signpost, support and prompt children, but we cannot deliver it all. Some of these things require skills that teachers just do not have.

How do our young children know what they will like, what interests they will have, and what challenges they might want to take on? Through the passport, we want to create a shared set of experiences, develop resilience, and enable children and families to develop relationships and connections outside of school.

It would be easy to make this another 'to do'. But in truth developing a 'passion' for something – almost anything – is itself enriching. Encouraging moments of awe and wonder are a core part of our purpose. Most things on the passport are free, but school can offer subsidised support for some that may carry a cost.
