Homework 2

Read to an adult **5** times a week. Practise counting to 10, 20 and 30, and count to 100 in 10s.

Activities from the list below are to be completed over a two-week period.

Communication and Literacy

1. Using one of your favourite stories from home. Can you find any words/letters that you can read or recognise?
2. Make a shopping list for your adult when you next go shopping.
3. Can you remember any sounds you have been learning in Phonics - Write them down? Can you write a word or sentence containing that sound?

Understanding the World

1. Search in your garden for minibeasts. Which minibeast did you find? Where did you find them? Talk about what their homes were like.
2. Find out something new about someone in your family. (Job, travels, talents)

Maths

1. Ask your adult to hide 10 of your toys. Hunt for them around the house, marking on a piece of paper each time you find one. As marks you could use pictures, numbers or tally.
2. Collect a range of items from your home. Can you measure them with a ruler or tape measure? Which is the longest/shortest?

Physical

1. Move around your house in different ways to music. Hop, skip, jog, side step, jump etc.
2. Help your adult set the table for dinner. Take care to put the fork and the knife in place carefully.

Don't forget to keep practicing writing your name each day. If you can write your first and second name, think of a sentence to write.

RE

1. Think about things that grow. Can you name any? What do they need to grow (love, care, food, water)? Draw a picture of anything you can think of that grows.
2. Find out about the story of Easter. What happened?

Expressive Art and Design

1. Build a structure with blocks or Lego. Could you design it first? Does it look like you wanted it to? What would you change?
2. Sing your favourite song to your adult. Can you make up your own song?

Personal, Social, Emotional

1. Draw or take a photo of your favourite activity or place. Describe what you like/dislike about it and why.
2. Play a turn taking game with your family.
