Apply for a place at St. Joseph's

Starting primary school is a very important time for you and your child, and at St. Joseph's we aim to make this a happy experience for everyone. Children can start school in our Reception class in the September of the academic year in which they will be five years old.

To gain a place at St. Joseph's, you will need to apply through Stockton-On-Tees Borough Council's website. Please click the link for more information or scan the QR code. Alternatively, you can contact the school office. www.stockton.gov.uk/apply-primary

If your child is not already attending our school Nursery, they will be invited to spend some informal sessions with their new teacher and other children from the class in the summer term in order to familiarise themselves with the school environment. An information evening for our new Reception class parents is also held in the summer term.

For mid-year admissions, at other times of the year or for year groups other than Reception, please go through Stockton-On-Tees Borough Council (https://www.stockton.gov.uk/article/2543/School-transfersand-in-year-admissions). We highly recommend contacting the school in the first instance for a visit.

Nursery Admissions
