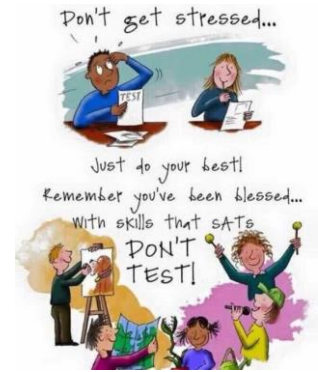
Welcome Back!

We will be taking part in planning and delivering Liturgical Prayer and exploring our faith throughout the Summer Term through our topics: Witnesses, Islam Week, Healing and Common good.



RSE

In RSE/PSHE lessons we will explore various topics including: Relationships and Sex Education, Reaching Out, Copyright and Ownership and Money and Emotional Wellbeing.

English

Our English curriculum allows the children to write with imagination and explore books of all types, whether it is escaping into the world of characters in fiction or finding out about the world and beyond with non-fiction. This term, our English topics will be: Myths and Legends, Poetry, Recounts and Narratives. Throughout each unit, we will be exploring text features and structure, as well as learning key grammatical skills appropriate to each text type. Additionally, we will be reading a wide range of texts, applying reading skills to comprehension texts and will also be developing our handwriting.



Reading – MyOn & Renaissance Every child has a login for MyOn and Renaissance, where they have been allocated books that match their reading ability. Once they have completed a book, they can then complete the comprehension quiz and gain points! We use MyOn in addition to the reading books they are allocated in school.

Geography – The Japanese Tsunami of 2011

Within this topic, we will be learning about tsunamis, with a particular focus on the Japanese tsunami of 2011.

History – Industrial Revolution

This half-term, we will be exploring Victorian Britain with a particular focus on the Industrial Revolution and people's experiences of the time.

Science – Electricity and Evolution and Inheritance

In our topic about Electricity, we will be learning about electrical circuits and the impact of changing components within a circuit. We will also plan and undertake our own investigations. Then, we will study the work of Charles Darwin and the impact his work had.

Other Curriculum Areas:

Computing: We will be working on Databases, Creating Games and online safety.

MFL: We will have Spanish lessons where we will learn vocabulary about Food and Musical Instruments.

Art & DT: In Art and DT, we will focus on Henry Moore and Costumes.
