<u>Maths</u>

Much of our number work this term will focus on: place value, fractions, decimals, percentages, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division. In Class 7, we need to be working hard to learn our multiplication and division tables. This term, we will be doing much more practice in class with weekly times table tests to monitor progress.

<u> Times Table Rock Stars – TTRS</u>

Across the weeks, I've asked you to practise your times tables. To help you, you could use the times table website timestable.co.uk and TT Rockstars.



<u>R.E</u>

This term, we will be focusing on the topics of Pentecost, Islam, Baptism and God's people. The children will be learning about different religions as well as focusing on topics which will help the Year 4s to prepare for their upcoming First Holy Communion.

<u>RSE/PSHE</u>

This term, we will explore a variety of different topics. These include the Church, online reputation, borrowing and keeping track of money and mental health. The topics covered will consist of a range of both written work and discussion.

<u>English</u>

We will be studying the features of different genres and using them to develop our own writing skills. The genres are:

- · Narratives
- · Diary Entries
- · Newspaper Articles

There will continue to be a strong emphasis on accuracy in punctuation and use of correct grammar in all written work. It is also important that handwriting is well-formed and accurate.

Spellings: Your child will be given weekly spellings which they can practise at home using the look, write check method. It is also useful to apply their spellings to sentences. Please encourage your children to learn their weekly spellings at home.

<u>Reading – MyOn & Renaissance</u>: Every child has a login for MyOn and Renaissance, where they have been allocated books that match their reading ability. Once they have completed a book, they can then complete the comprehension quiz and gain points! We use MyOn in addition to the reading books they are allocated in school.

History – Comparing Ancient Civilisations

In history, we will be comparing Ancient Civilisations looking at Ancient Egypt, Ancient Sumer, Indus Valley and Shang Dynasty. We will be looking at what all of these civilisations have in common.

Science – Electricity and Sound.

In Electricity, we will be looking at the names of the different parts of an electrical circuit. We will also be looking at which kind of materials can conduct electricity. In Sound, we will be looking at sound waves and also how the ear translates vibrations into sound.

<u>Geography – Angry Earth</u>

In geography, we will be looking at the structure of the Earth and what each section is called. We will also be looking at the structure of volcanoes and what causes them to erupt.


Other Curriculum Areas
