# <u>R.E</u>

We will be taking part in planning and delivering Liturgical Prayer and exploring our faith throughout the Summer Term through our topics: Witnesses, Healing and Common good.



<u>RSE</u>

In RSE/PSHE lessons we will explore various topics including: Relationships and Sex Education, Reaching Out, Copyright and Ownership and Money and Emotional Wellbeing.

### <u>English</u>

Our English curriculum allows the children to write with imagination and explore books of all types, whether it is escaping into the world of characters in fiction or finding out about the world and beyond with non-fiction. This term, our English topics will be: Myths and Legends, Poetry, Recounts and Narratives. Throughout each unit we will be



exploring text features and structure, as well as learning key grammatical skills appropriate to each text type. Additionally, we will be reading a wide range of texts, applying reading skills to comprehension texts and will also be developing our handwriting.

<u>Reading – MyOn & Renaissance</u> Every child has a login for MyOn and Renaissance, where they have been allocated books that match their reading ability. Once they have completed a book, they can then complete the comprehension quiz and gain points! We use MyOn in addition to the reading books they are allocated in school.
