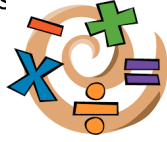
Welcome Back!

Welcome back Class 11! Following what has hopefully been a wonderful and fun-filled Christmas Break we are ready to continue our learning and hard-work in preparation for the KS2 SATs later this academic year. In Class 11, our teacher is Miss Houghton and our teaching assistant is Mrs Gentle.

Maths

The main areas we will cover this Term are: Place value, Four Operations, Measures, Geometry and Fractions, Decimals and Percentages

To make sure that we are able to rise to the challenge of the end of Key Stage tests, we are focusing on the four basic number rules so that we can use and apply them to all maths topics. We will be practising Arithmetic and Times Tables daily to ensure we are able to use these facts fluently.

R.E

We will be taking part in planning and delivering Liturgical Prayer and exploring our faith throughout the Spring Term through our topics: Mission, Memorial Sacrifice and Sacrifice.

Throughout these topics we will be exploring how, as Christians, we are called to serve and the Sacrifice Jesus made for us.



RSE

In RSE/PSHE lessons we will explore various topics including: Body Image, Peculiar Feelings, Emotional Changes, Health and Wellbeing, Privacy and Security and Big Dreams.

English

Our English curriculum allows the children to write with imagination and explore books of all types, whether it is escaping into the world of characters in fiction or finding out about the world and beyond with non-fiction. This term, our English topics will be: Balanced Arguments, Play scripts, Recounts and Narratives. Throughout each unit we will be exploring text features and structure, as well as learning key grammatical skills appropriate to each text type. Additionally, we will be reading a wide range of texts, applying reading skills to comprehension texts and will also be developing our handwriting.



Spellings Your child will be given weekly spellings which they can practise at home or before school from 8:30am in our homework club. It is also useful to apply their spellings to sentences.

Reading – MyOn & Renaissance Every child has a login for MyOn and Renaissance, where they have been allocated books that match their reading ability. Once they have completed a book, they can then complete the comprehension quiz and gain points! We use MyOn in addition to the reading books they are allocated in school.

Geography – Natural Resources

Within this topic, we will be learning about the Earth's natural resources and why they are important to us.

History – Industrial Revolution

After half-term we will be exploring the Industrial Revolution and the major impact this had on British Society and the modern world.

Science – Light and Seeing

In our topic about Light and Seeing we will explore how light travels and how we see, including identifying parts of the eye. We will also investigate how shadows are formed, how reflections occur and how rainbows are formed.

MFL: We will have Spanish lessons where we will learn vocabulary about the Seasons, Family and Pets.

Art & DT: In Art and DT we will focus on Henry Moore and Balanced Meals.
