<u>Maths</u>

Number work this term will focus on place value, fractions, decimals, percentages, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division. We will also be looking at measurement, including that of volume and capacity, and length and mass.

In Class 7 we need to be working hard to learn our multiplication and division tables. This term we will be doing much more practice in class with weekly times table tests to monitor progress.

<u>R.E</u>

This term we will be focusing on the topic of giving all. The children will learn of the importance of going the extra mile to help those in need around them. They will also look at the difference between givers and takers.

<u>RSE/PSHE</u>

This term, we will explore a variety of different topics. These include changes in our bodies, lifecycles, what we are thankful for, health wellbeing and lifestyle, copyright and ownership, and sharing our love through actions with those around us.

<u>English</u>

We will be studying the features of different genres and using them to develop our own writing skills. The genres are;

- \cdot Persuasive Writing
- \cdot Diary
- \cdot Letter

There will continue to be a strong emphasis on accuracy in punctuation and use of correct grammar in all written work. It is also important that handwriting is well formed and accurate.

Spellings: Your child will be given weekly spellings which they can practise at home using the look, write check method. It is also useful to apply their spellings to sentences. Please encourage your children to learn their weekly spellings at home.

<u>Reading – MyOn & Renaissance</u>: Every child has a login for MyOn and Renaissance, where they have been allocated books that match their reading ability. Once they have completed a book, they can then complete the comprehension quiz and gain points! We use MyOn in addition to the reading books they are allocated in school.

Geography – Volcanoes
