Share a variety of books with your family. Practise counting to 10 and beyond.

Activities from the list below are to be completed over a two-week period.

Communication and Literacy

1. Can you remember one of your favourite stories from nursery? What was it called? Try to tell your grown up what happens in the story. Can you draw a picture of one of the characters?
2. Play 'Simon Says' with someone in your family. Take turns to give and receive instructions. Do not forget only do it if they say, 'Simon Says'.

Understanding the World

1. It is so important to recycle our rubbish – can you help your grown up to sort items that can be recycled and items that cannot?
2. Draw a picture of your favourite animal. Think about where that animal lives.

Maths

1. Ask your grown up to help you. They say a number from 0-10 and you show them that many fingers.
2. Pretend to be marching like a soldier and count how many steps to the end of the garden or room.
3. When outside ask an adult to collect 5 sticks or items. Can you count them and check they have 5? Repeat with other numbers.

Physical

1. If you have children's scissors can you cut out a square shape from a piece of paper? Can you make a robot?
2. Can you do all the actions for the song – Head, shoulders, knees, and toes?

Do not forget to keep practicing drawing and having a go at writing your first name.

RE

1. At nursery we learn how to be a good friend. Can you think of how you are a good friend? Draw a picture of you and your friends.

Expressive Art and Design

1. Can you make up a new song or dance and teach your family?
2. Find some small boxes and make a model. How are you going to stick them together?

Personal, Social, Emotional

1. Talk about why it is important to be a good friend. Can you take turns with games and share your sweets?
2. Talk to your grown up about road safety. When out on your walk, see if you can remember the rules and why it is important for us to follow them.
