Take leaf and bark rubbings. What other interesting items can you take rubbings from? Make a picture collage with your work.

Lay on the floor and look up and watch the clouds drift in the sky.

What shapes can you see?

Are they moving fast or slow?

Which is your favourite and why?

Put your thoughts together and write a poem.



Go on a minibeast hunt outside. Which bugs can you find? Imagine you were a minibeast. Which one would you be and why? Write a short story. Where would you live? What would you do in your day? Who would be your enemy!? Remember to make your story exciting!

## Nature Detective

Go in to the garden or park at different times of the day. Listen and look. What do you hear, say feel? Can you tell your adult some interesting words about it? Challenge – write a diary of the sounds you hear across the day.





Find a stone and turn it into an animal. Think abut the shape of your stone, is it small, big, tall? What animal could it be? You might want to make more than one and make your own farm or zoo.



Collect, leaves, mud and twigs, pebbles or anything else you can find to make your own potion. How many ingredients have you added? How has the texture changed? Imagine your potion has a superpower, what would it be and why?
