School Uniform

We would like to tighten up on school uniform expectations. Recently, we have noticed an increase in trainers being worn and brightly coloured sports kits replacing PE uniform.

3. No makeup or nail varnish
4. Children may wear their PE kits on PE days (plain white T-shirt, not football colours)
5. School shoes must be worn inside the building

At St Joseph's, every school day counts. Strong attendance and punctuality help children build friendships, develop confidence, and make consistent academic progress. We have robust procedures to support families where attendance or punctuality is a challenge—please reach out if we can help. A reminder that term-time holidays cannot be authorised. Even short absences can disrupt learning. Our attendance remains excellent and continues to improve. It currently stands at 97.1%, well above the national average.
