

# **Key Reminders for Parents/Carers**

#### Vaping/Smoking

Vaping and smoking are not permitted on the school premises. Please refrain from using them until you have left our ground.

#### Dogs


We want all of our children attending Nursery and Early Years to be toilet trained as soon as possible. This will allow our staff more time to deliver key interventions and support with learning.

#### St Joseph's Journey to 100%

Thank you to all of you who attended the attendance meetings over the last half term. It was really helpful to discuss your child's attendance and agree next steps.

We are making a strong effort to improve attendance, as our current absence rates are still above the national average. Missed hours and days in school leads to missed learning and poorer outcomes, both academically and socially.

Please see Miss Harrison if you require any information regarding the latest changes with national and regional attendance legislation.

#### **Each Week**

The class with the best attendance will be awarded £10 or £20 to go into their piggy bank. There will also be spot prizes for the least late marks and most improved. Classes can save up their money and then collectively decide what they would like to spend their money on from our Attendance Menu.

#### **Each Half Term**

The class with the best attendance for the half term will be awarded additional money for their piggy bank.

Each child with 100% attendance will receive a special certificate and a prize.

#### **Each Term**

The class with the best attendance for the term will receive a certificate and an attendance badge.

#### I Can Achieve

Each child in our care can achieve anything they put their mind to and can be anything they want to be. With an ambitious curriculum focussed on excellence, with encouragement, and through a nurturing environment, we inspire them to strive for success, dream big and realise their full potential.

We empower children to seize opportunities given to them. We help them explore new experiences, develop their talents, and build confidence in their abilities.

We instil in every child a sense of belonging and purpose, reminding them that they are loved exactly how God created them and have a duty to live out our Character Virtues and Gospel Values. This understanding fosters a spirit of compassion and respect for themselves and others.



#### I Belong to God's World

We encourage children to recognise they belong to a world beyond the place where they live that they can explore but have a responsibility to care for. By teaching them about diversity and the importance of responsibility as God's children, we help them appreciate their connections to others and inspire them to make a positive impact in the world around them.

#### **Uniform and PE Kits**

Thank you to everyone who is supporting our uniform policy, our children are looking incredibly smart. We are committed to ensuring that our children take pride in their appearance; our uniform is a representation of the high expectations we uphold and it reflects our sense of unity as one family.

**PE Kits and Clubs:** PE kits are only to be worn on designated PE days. If your child attends an afterschool club which is **not** on their PE day, they are to wear their uniform and may bring a change of shoes in a bag for club.

**Branded Clothing:** We have noticed a small number of children wearing branded tracksuits, which does not comply with our uniform policy. Please ensure your child wears a plain navy blue or plain black jogger suit/shorts, along with a plain white t-shirt or polo top. School jumpers and cardigans can be worn. Please note that grey or other colours are not part of our uniform.

#### PE Days - Please note the following changes

The days for PE during Spring 1 are as follows:

EYFS - Monday & Wednesday

Year 1 & 2 - Monday & Tuesday

**Year 3 & 4 –** Tuesday & Friday (Swimming but children are still to wear full uniform)

Year 5 & 6 - Monday & Tuesday

**Hair, Earrings, Nails and Make Up:** Hair should be tied back in a bobble. Earrings and makeup are not permitted in school. Your child will be asked to remove their earrings which will be returned at the end of the day. They will also be asked to remove any makeup. Nail varnish or false nails is not allowed.

**Trainers:** Coloured trainers, or trainers with white soles/logos are not permitted. Any trainers worn must be **completely** black – black soles, laces, logos etc.

**Crocs:** Crocs are <u>not</u> permitted in school under any circumstances. They are not a part of our uniform policy and are not safe to wear in and around school. If your child comes to school wearing crocs, you will be asked to bring shoes into school.

### **Online Learning Platforms**

#### Lexia

Your child now has a Lexia log in which they can access at home. It is an online platform that accelerate reading/literacy skills development through fun and interactive games, that can be used alongside traditional one to one reading with your child.

Their engagement is tracked by their class teacher.

We strongly encourage all children to access this at least 3 times per week at home.



#### **Times Table Rock Stars**

All children from Year 1 to Year 6 have a Times Table Rockstar log in which is an online maths programme that helps develop rapid recall of times tables, which are vital throughout education and life. Children can create their own avatar and compete against friends and other classes.
