

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading

Their end is destruction, their god is their belly, and they glory in their shame, with minds set on earthly things. But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself. Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm thus in the Lord, my beloved.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke. Glory to you, O Lord.

At that time: Jesus took with him Peter and John and James and went up on the mountain to pray. And as he was praying, the appearance of his face was altered, and his clothing became dazzling white. And behold, two men were talking with him, Moses and Elijah, who appeared in glory and spoke of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and those who were with him were heavy with sleep, but when they became fully awake they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him.

And as the men were parting from him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah' - not knowing what he said. As he was saying these things, a cloud came and overshadowed them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, 'This is my Son, my Chosen One; listen to him!' And when the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and told no one in those days anything of what they had seen.

Bless your faithful, we pray, O Lord, with a blessing that endures for ever, and keep them faithful to the Gospel of your Begotten Son, so that they may always desire and at last attain that glory whose beauty he showed in his own Body, to the amazement of his Apostles. Through Christ our Lord.

And may the blessing of almighty God, the Father, and the Son, ₱ and the Holy Spirit, come down on you and remain with you for ever.

Our Faith on Sunday

GOSPEL REFLECTION



Today's Gospel reading seems rather a strange one for the season of Lent. Luke describes Jesus being glory. Peter in his spontaneous, impulsive way wants to set up tents and stay there, but that is not what

Jesus intends. Both Matthew and Mark describe the same episode in similar ways, but what is strangely transfigured and shown in all his missing from Luke's account is the reference to the resurrection. If ever we feel we haven't understood Jesus, and especially his death on


the cross, we can find consolation in Peter. On many occasions he reacts angrily, or speaks out of turn, or just gets it wrong. He even denies Jesus almost immediately after promising he would never do so. And yet Jesus chose him as the rock on which his Church would be built. Peter's 'saving grace' was that he always returned to Jesus. As we live, with Jesus, the horror story of his passion and death on the cross, we need to remind ourselves that it didn't all end there – it finished in glory.



RECOVERING KINDNESS

223. Saint Paul describes kindness as a fruit of the Holy Spirit (Gal 5:22). He uses the Greek word chrestótes, which describes an attitude that is gentle, pleasant and supportive, not rude or coarse. Individuals who possess this quality help make other people's lives more bearable, especially by sharing the weight of their problems, needs and fears. This way of treating others can take different forms: an act of kindness, a concern not to offend by word or deed, a readiness to alleviate their burdens. It involves "speaking words of comfort, strength, consolation and encouragement" and not "words that demean, sadden, anger or show scorn". 208

The responses given to the two pre-synodal consultations spoke of a great variety of situations and the new challenges that they pose. In addition to those already mentioned, many of the respondents pointed to the problems families face in raising children. In many cases, parents come home exhausted, not wanting to talk, and many families no longer even share a common meal. Distractions abound, including an addiction to television. This makes it all the more difficult for parents to hand on the faith to their children. Other responses pointed to the effect of severe stress on families, who often seem more caught up with securing their future than with enjoying the present. This is a broader cultural problem, aggravated by fears about steady employment, finances and the future of children.
