Then the Deacon, or the Priest, says:



GOSPEL REFLECTION



Recently I saw a fig tree in the

South of England which, to my

surprise, had figs on its branches.

Most of the fig trees here never

produce any fruit, and any amount

of waiting will not change that.

Sometimes we may feel like the

barren fig trees and that we will always be the same and that no amount of praying or masses or confessions will help us change. But God never sets us a task that impossible achieve. We are made for heaven, for life with him and he will do whatever

is necessary to get us there. So why do we often feel we face an impossible task? We think we can do it with our own willpower and determination, despite the fact that we know from experience that this doesn't work. In John's Gospel,

Jesus says, "Without me you can do nothing." He doesn't say "you can't do much," he says 'nothing". So the key is in doing things with him. When it comes to difficulties and temptations we find almost impossible to deal with, we must hand them over to him. If we could have managed to succeed under our own steam, then his dying in agony on the cross would have been futile. But his suffering and death enabled us to enter into a relationship with God and gace us the possibility of rising with him.

RECOVERING KINDNESS

224. Kindness frees us from the cruelty that at times infects human relationships, from the anxiety that prevents us from thinking of others, from the frantic flurry of activity that forgets that others also have a right to be happy. Often nowadays we find neither the time nor the energy to stop and be kind to others, to say "excuse me", "pardon me", "thank you". Yet every now and then, miraculously, a kind person appears and is willing to set everything else aside in order to show interest, to give the gift of a smile, to speak a word of encouragement, to listen amid general indifference. If we make a daily effort to do exactly this, we can create a healthy social atmosphere in which misunderstandings can be overcome and conflict forestalled. Kindness ought to be cultivated; it is no superficial bourgeois virtue. Precisely because it entails esteem and respect for others, once kindness becomes a culture within society it transforms lifestyles, relationships and the ways ideas are discussed and compared. Kindness facilitates the quest for consensus; it opens new paths where hostility and conflict would burn all bridges.



LOVE IN THE FAMILY


