GOSPEL REFLECTION



The cross is the great scandal at the heart of Christianity. How could the almighty, omnipotent and all-loving God be condemned to die as a criminal, and in such a barbaric fashion? In his letter to the Philippians St. Paul tells us that this was only possible because Jesus emptied himself, allowing himself to become one of us. When Jesus says that anyone who wants to be his disciple must take up their cross, he is asking us to follow his example: I must be ready to empty myself. Empty myself of what? Of everything that could prevent me from giving my full attention to my neigbour who is next to me in any given moment. This does not only mean emptying myself of all those

vices such as greed, selfishness, arrogance, envy, etc. which makes it difficult or even impossible to love my neighbour. To love my neighbour, I must be empty of everything, even my good intentions, so as to possess nothing but pure love for the person in front of me. It is the type of love that we see in Jesus when he encounters the Samaritan woman at the well, the blind Bartimeus who begs that he may see, the woman caught in adultery. It was this sort of love which Jesus demonstrated when faced with his executioners when he asked his Father in heaven to forgive them. Whenever we love in this way, we are truly taking up our cross.

FORGIVING BUT Not Forgetting

250. Forgiving does not mean forgetting. Or better, in the face of a reality that can in no way be denied, relativized or concealed, forgiveness is still possible. In the face of an action that can never be tolerated, justified or excused, we can still forgive. In the face of something that cannot be forgotten for any reason, we can still forgive. Free and heartfelt forgiveness is something noble, a reflection of God's own infinite ability to forgive. If forgiveness is gratuitous, then it can be shown even to someone who resists repentance and is unable to beg pardon.

Love believes all things

Panta pisteúei. Love believes all things. Here "belief" is not to be taken in its strict theological meaning, but more in the sense of what we mean by "trust". This goes beyond simply presuming that the other is not lying or cheating. Such basic trust recognizes God's light shining beyond the darkness, like an ember glowing beneath the ash...This trust enables a relationship to be free. It means we do not have to control the other person, to follow their every step lest they escape ourgrip. Love trusts, it sets free, it does not try to control, possess and dominate everything. This freedom, which fosters independence, an openness to the world around us and to new experiences, can only enrich and expand relationships. The spouses then share with one another the joy of all they have received and learned outside the family circle. At the same time, this free-dom makes for sincerity and transparency, for those who know that they are trusted and ap-preciated can be open and hide nothing.
