| Understanding of the World | Begin to make sense of their own life-story and family's history Talk about what they see, using a wide vocabulary. | |
| Expressive Arts and Design | Use 'paint' ICT to draw self Self-portraits using mirrors Explore different art - Kandinsky and Pollock | |
