A warm welcome to Reception!

The children have quickly settled into Reception and have made a great start with their learning. We have an exciting curriculum this year and we are here to support you and your children every step of the way. The page below outlines what children will be learning over the term.

Homework

Homework will be set on Seesaw on a **Monday**, which will include a weekly maths activity and a phonic activity at your child's level. Homework must be completed on a **Friday**.

Additionally, children can take home a book of their choice from our library to enjoy at home. This will be a book to share with an adult.

Reminders

PE is on **Tuesday**, children must wear **full PE tracksuit**, which consists of the school tracksuit or a plain black tracksuit (not branded), white t-shirt and plain trainers.
