<u>Homework</u>

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As a staff we have had a review of homework and the impact it has on the standards of the pupils alongside their enjoyment of learning. We absolutely do not want to send out homework for the sake of it and add any pressure at home. This year there is a focus on spelling, as identified as an area of development across the school, and to support this we have purchased a new resource called 'Spelling Shed'/'edshed' .This has some great interactive resources for the children to complete which will impact on the spellings they are learning in school that week. Reading continues to have a huge focus and the pupils will have access to 'Reading for Pleasure' books which they will bring home. The younger children will also have access to their Read. Write Inc books on a 3 day cycle and it is important that they read them at home. Children may also be directed to Lexia or Reading Plus activities, depending on where they are in their reading. For maths, to impact on their speedy recall of number facts, we continue to use Numbots and TTRockstars. In addition to this, Year 6 will be provided with some revision-based homework in the Spring Term.

Finally, we will be sending out termly 'project' based tasks with a choice of activities for you to complete as a family. We will send more information in the coming weeks.

<u>Attendance</u>

The attendance percentages across school improved last year, which is great, but it is very important that we strive to maintain, or even better, further improve this. Attached to the email with this newsletter is a poster which highlight the impact absence at school has on pupils learning. It is very easy for a pupil to drop to 90% which is then classed as persistent absence. If your child is absent, school must be **contacted by 9.30 am for every day of absence**.
