<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use 2create a story on Purple Mash to retell a story or create your own. • Design a teddy bear or a doll on Purple Mash. Can you stay within the lines when colouring? Experiment with different colours, textures and thicknesses of pens. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Play a game with some people in your family, where you take turns and follow rules. It could be a board game, card game, etc. Think about why it is important to take turns and follow the rules. • Help out at home – this could be tidying your bedroom, putting your toys away, etc. without being asked! 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Go on a winter walk – take photos or draw pictures to show what you saw. How do the trees compare from autumn to winter? • Use a magnet to identify magnetic objects in your home.

Keep trying to beat your best score! • Go for a walk with your family. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To identify and name 2d and 3d shapes. You could make a shape picture or a model and name the 2d/3d shapes that you have used. • Identify coins and practice using them to make amounts within 20. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make a poster about your favourite toy. Why is it your favourite? What does it do? • Talk to an older relative about their favourite toy when they were a child. How does it compare to the toys you have now?

Please ensure that the 'Non-Negotiable' homework is regularly completed and then complete at least 1 bullet point from each subject area. The children can present their homework in a variety of ways- in their Homework book, by sending photos/evidence via SeeSaw or bringing in to school any evidence that they have completed the task. Children will be rewarded with Dojo points for completing their homework. Spellings are updated on Spelling Shed once a test has been completed. Homework will be shared as a class and celebrated. The deadline for homework is Thursday 28th March.
