We provide a curriculum, which is broad and balanced, recognising that every pupil is unique. Our curriculum is designed to enable all children to achieve, reach their potential and let their lights shine. Teaching and learning at St. Joseph's has many creative elements and we aim to make learning relevant to the children and their local area.


We follow the R.E. programme 'Come and See', supplemented by a variety of materials that help children grow in faith, understanding and relationship with God. Prayers are said each day, class Celebration of the Word every week and there is a regular programme of class masses.

The curriculum presently comprises the following subjects – R.E., RHE, English, Maths, Science, Computing, History, Geography, Art, Design Technology, P.E., Music, MFL and PSHE. The Reception class follow the Foundation Stage Curriculum.

We recognise, not only the importance of helping our pupils to flourish academically but also spiritually, morally, socially and culturally, so they are fully prepared for life in British society and for their role as citizens. We incorporate democratic principles, value the rule of law, support individual liberty and foster a community in which different faiths and beliefs are respected.

Parents are invited into school throughout the year to learn about the curriculum and how they can help and support their child's learning. In the Autumn Term Parents are invited to a Curriculum Awareness Evening where they are given an overview of their child's learning.





## **SEND**



#### **Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)**

We differentiate activities to help those children who experience learning difficulties. We work closely with outside agencies and our designated Educational Psychologist if further support is requested.

We work with the guidelines and regulations of the Code of Practice (New SEND reforms) for Special Educational Needs in all cases.

At our school we value that fact that all of our children are unique and different with a range of different strengths and talents. We recognise that some children need additional support to be able to access the curriculum. We differentiate activities to help those children who experience learning difficulties, whilst working closely, where necessary, with outside agencies such as:

- School nurse
- Speech and Language Service
- Occupational Therapy
- ASD (Autism Spectrum Disorder) Team
- Educational Psychology

We pride ourselves on working together closely with families and children to work quickly and get the best plan possible in place should your child need additional support.

If your child, at some point throughout the school journey, needs this additional support please don't worry, sometimes this is just intervention or support for a short time and can be tailored to your child's individual needs. Our SENCO (Special Educational Needs Co- Ordinator) is there to provide support.



# Chadwick's Kitchen



Our award winning in-house catering team Chadwick's Kitchen, provide catering services across the Trust.

We use fresh ingredients to prepare healthy and nutritionally balanced meals each day. The majority of our menus are homemade by our chefs in our kitchens.

Staff are trained to accommodate medical diets and work in partnership with parents to ensure these needs are met. As part of the Trust's commitment to sustainability, we regularly review food miles and continue to work to reduce food waste.

Parents/Carers can pay for school meals using ParentPay.

Pupils entitled to free meals are allowed to purchase food to the value of a free school meal allowance daily.
