Safer Internet Day

Safer Internet Day takes place in February of each year to raise awareness of a safer and better internet for all, and especially for children and young people.

Safer Internet Day this year will take place on 11th February 2025 with celebrations and learning based around the theme "Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online.'

Safer Internet Day is the UK's biggest celebration of online safety. Each year we cover an online issue of theme that speaks about the things young people are seeing and experiencing online. Created in consultation with young people across the UK, this year Safer Internet Day will be focusing on the issue of scams online and for young people, how to protect themselves and others as well as what support is available to them.

Lasting for forty days, from Ash Wednesday to the evening of Holy Thursday, the season draws us towards the light of Christ. During this special time in the Church's liturgical year, we will journey towards Easter with an open heart and with a focus preparing ourselves to be the best that we can be.



Sc.Out.Ed and Swimming Lessons

Class 2 and Class 3 pupils will be taking part in Sc.Out.Ed lessons on a Friday afternoon during the Spring Term. These are outdoor learning lessons essential for healthy child development. Children are asked to come to school in their school uniform, but bring a suitable warm, waterproof clothing and shoes for an outdoor lesson to change into.

Class 4 pupils will attend swimming lessons at Shotton Primary School every Tuesday during the Spring Term. Pupils are to continue to wear their school uniform on a Tuesday and not PE kit.

Swimming kit required is as follows:

- All children must wear a one-piece costume or lycra trunks. No bikinis or swimming shorts.
- Goggles are allowed, but not required.
- Large towel, comb/brush.
- Swimming cap.

A coach will collect the Year 5 and 6's from school at 9:00am prompt and they will return in time for lunch.

Jewellery / Nail Varnish

We have noticed an increase in children coming into school wearing earrings and jewellery. Please can we remind you, that for health and safety reasons, pupils must not wear jewellery for school. If pupils wish they can wear a wrist watch for school, however this must not be a watch that has access to messaging, camera etc.

We have also seem a significant rise in children coming to school wearing nail varnish, please can you ensure that nail varnish is removed before children come to school.
