Dur school day

Nursery: Morning session only: 8:50am - 11:50am

Reception to Year 6: Our doors are open from 8:40am and children can come into school from this time. A member of staff will be on door duty to take messages etc

- School day runs from 8:55am 3:15pm.
- Break time is 10:30 10:45am.

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- Lunchtime is 12:00pm 1:00pm.
- KS1 have an additional break in the afternoon from 2:10pm 2:20pm.

Breakfast Club:

Breakfast club is available from 8am every morning. Cost is currently £2 per day but there will be an increase in September 2024 to £2.50 per day. The children enjoy a breakfast of cereal, fruit, yogurt, toast or bagels.

> Afterschool Child Care (September 2024): The school offers a range of after school clubs on a rata basis throughout year.

is a family of 35 schools across County Durham, Darlington, Hartlepool, and Stockton-On-Tees.


Our mission is to provide the highest quality education, fostering a collaborative environment where resources and best practices are shared among our schools.

Apply for a place at St. Joseph's

Starting primary school is a very important time for you and your child and at St. Joseph's, we aim to make this a happy experience for everyone. Children can start school in our reception class in the September of the academic year in which they will be five years old.

To gain a place at St. Joseph's, you will need to apply through Hartlepool Borough Council's website. Please click the link for more information or scan the QR code. Alternatively, you can contact the school office https:// stjosephshartlepool.bhcet.org.uk/information/admissions-policy

If your child is not already attending our school Nursery, they will be invited to spend some informal sessions with their new teacher and other children from the class in the summer term in order to familiarise themselves with the school environment. An information evening for our new Reception class parents is also held in the summer term.

For mid-year admissions, at other times of the year or for year groups other than Reception, please go through Hartlepool Borough Council (https://www.hartlepool.gov.uk/info/20014/schools_and_learning/655/ in_year_school_admissions). We highly recommend contacting the school in the first instance for a visit.

Nursery Admissions
