Class News – Y6 Year 6 have worked extremely hard this term. They have completed their Maths topics of Fractions and are now moving on to their Converting Units topic. Within English, the children have wrote from the perspective of the Windrush Generation and have even wrote a persuasive letter to Mrs Hargreaves. They have completed their Reading topic 'Into the Jungle'. Within their Science lessons, Year 6 have looked at the circulatory system and have labelled the heart. They have conducted an investigation looking at the effects exercise has on heart rate and recorded their results. Within Geography, the children have been learning about USA. They can name the 50 states and have looked at extreme weather including hurricanes and wildfires. Well done for all of your hard work this term Y6.

Class News - Y4/5 For the children in Year 4/5, this term has been extremely hectic. They have studied area and perimeter in maths. They are currently studying division and multiplication, which includes dividing and multiplying two- and three-digit numbers by one-digit numbers as well as working through remainder problems. They are reading Beowulf in English, and the unit's mastery focus is on using expanded noun phrases to depict settings, characters, and atmosphere; to express complex material concisely; and to incorporate dialogue to develop the action and portray characters. They studied the topic Advent—gift—in RE. The children have had a great time during Advent, going to liturgies, dancing on disconight, and seeing the nativity performed by KS 1. Additionally, the Year 4/5 pupils were fortunate to have the chance to attend Stockton Riverside College and see Shrek the Musical. For the final week of classes, there will be some engaging Christmas-themed activities. The kids are undoubtedly excited for the Christmas break. I hope they enjoy a relaxing holiday and a joyous Christmas season!

Class News - Year 3 / 4. The children have had a lovely half term. They have thoroughly enjoyed our class reader on magic – I am sure they have told you about The Place Inbetween! The children were absolutely amazing in their class liturgy on Medjugorje and they have loved learning about this very special place. Class News – EYFS We have had another busy few weeks in Early Years. We finished reading The Gingerbread Man story and enjoyed doing some Science, Maths and English related to the story, we also had fun decorating biscuits and eating them. We enjoyed a special visit from Tees Valley Music, where we joined in singing, dancing and playing instruments. We appreciate that from time to time that children are ill but attendance at school is really important.

Attached is an overview of some of the guidance regarding illness.

Rashes and skin infections	Recommended period to be kept away from school, nursery or childminders
Athlete's foot	None
Chickenpox*	Until all vesicles have crusted over
Cold sores, (Herpes simplex)	None
German measles (rubella)*	Four days from onset of rash (as per "Green Book")
Hand, foot and mouth	None
Impetigo	Until lesions are crusted and healed, or 48 hours after commencing antibiotic treatment
Measles*	Four days from onset of rash
Molluscum contagiosum	None
Ringworm	Exclusion not usually required
Roseola (infantum)	None
Scabies	Child can return after first treatment
Scarlet fever*	Child can return 24 hours after commencing appropriate antibiotic treatment
Slapped cheek (fifth disease or parvovirus B19)	None once rash has developed
Shingles	Exclude only if rash is weeping and cannot be covered
Warts and verrucae	None
Diarrhoea and vomiting illness	Recommended period to be kept away from school, nursery or childminders
Diarrhoea and/or vomiting	48 hours from last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting
