**Class News** – **Y6** Y6 have had some exciting times recently. We participated in a Teams call with Computer Scientist Dr Daly when celebrating the love for Maths on Valentines Day. A lot of the children in our class have been to multiple sports trips at English Martyrs. We even reached the Dodgeball and Basketball Town finals. The children will be moving onto their next Reading topic after the half-term holidays which will be about The Explorer by Katherine Rundell. We will be finishing up on our Selfish Giant writing topic, which the children have excelled in, and will be moving on to 'The Day the War Came' by Nicola Davies. Throughout Science, Y6 have learned all about the solar system, including the planets, phases of the moon and the Sun. Within our next Science topic, we will be learning about Forces. Y6 have begun their new History topic (Victorian Britain: The Industrial Revolution) and will continue this after the next half-term. Throughout Art, they have created Memory Museums and have extremely enjoyed this. Well done on all of your hard work and resilience Y6!

**Class News – Y4/5** Year 4/5 children have been extremely busy over the last couple of weeks in terms of learning and attending various activities. In maths, they have completed the topic of multiplication and division and are now learning about fractions. In English, they have completed reading Arthur and the Golden Rope and are now busy planning to write their own adventure story. In science, they are having fun studying about rocks and in their most recent lesson, they learnt about the various kinds of rocks and used a variety of chocolates to help them interpret and perceive the idea. In the end, they were able to sample every chocolate! In RE, they are learning about World War II, its impact on Britain, and comparing it with current scenarios. They have taken pleasure in participating in peer mentoring, a variety of sporting events, and most recently, a Judo taster session. **Reminders for the next term**: Children need to bring their PE kit to school on Monday and leave it in the locker. They can take it back home on Friday after school. Children need to bring their reading journal and reading book to school every day. To practice their times

**Class News - Year 3 / 4**. The children had a great time yesterday at the Judo taster session - see Facebook for pictures. Over the last few weeks, children have enjoyed writing about carnivorous plants and learning about the different ways prey is caught. Our class are trialling a new RE Curriculum and the children are really enjoying it. We have been learning about the ways Jesus performed miracles and showed compassion in Matthew's Gospel. Could I please remind parents/carers to sign children's reading records and to practise spellings at home (both daily). Have a wonderful half term and I hope we have some sunshine! **Class News – Year 1 / 2** This half term Year ½ have completed the Ruby Robin Award and received certificates and badges for their achievement in helping songbirds. In English, they have been looking at the story of 'George and the Dragon'. In Art, they have made different paper sculptures including a tree of life and a giant spider. In February, they visited Hartlepool Museum to learn about what happens in a museum and they also visited the Art Gallery. At the Art Gallery, they enjoyed making their own clay sculptures. On Number Day, the class enjoyed dressing up as 'Times Tables Rockstars' and taking part in different maths activities. In RE, they have learned about special people within the church and started to look at the Eucharist.

**Class News** – **EYFS** In EYFS Nursery have been learning about the number 3 and its composition, and their phonics focus has been centred around people who help us, this week was the Dentist. Pupils have clapped syllables, listened to and described sounds, and have sorted words into groups with the same 'beginning with' sound. Speaking of which, toothbrushing continues each day in the morning and children are reminded they should be brushing their teeth at home (helped by an adult of course) in the morning and before bed, and we have been focusing on oral health. Reception children have been matching numerals to 20 and understanding the final number is the total when counting to 10 and beyond. We have been problem solving in our play throughout the EYFS setting around the theme of the The Three Little Pigs which is our focus text.



## The School Day

The children need to be in school by 8:40am so that they are ready and in class to start the school day by 8.50am. The gates to the playground are locked at 8:45am. We would ask that the children do not play on the field or equipment before school, if it has rained the children will end up being wet and muddy for the day.

You will appreciate that we have procedures in place to keep the children safe in school and as they leave the building. If you are not able to pick your child up the school needs to hold details of who is collecting the child, their details and a safe word. Please return the form that has been sent separately.

German measles (rubella)*	Four days from onset of rash (as per "Green Book")

Impetigo	Until lesions are crusted and healed, or 48 hours after commencing antibiotic treatment
Measles*	Four days from onset of rash
Molluscum contagiosum	None
Ringworm	Exclusion not usually required
Roseola (infantum)	None
Scabies	Child can return after first treatment
Scarlet fever*	Child can return 24 hours after commencing appropriate antibiotic treatment
Slapped cheek (fifth disease or parvovirus B19)	None once rash has developed
Shingles	Exclude only if rash is weeping and cannot be covered
Warts and verrucae	None
Diarrhoea and	
vomiting illness	Recommended period to be kept away from school, nursery or childminders
Diarrhoea and/or vomiting	48 hours from last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting
