**Class News** – **Y6**. Well done to all Year 6 for completing their SATs. They all showed great resilience and confidence- we were all extremely proud. Moving forward, the children are continuing with their writing of narratives, they will complete their Science topics of Forces move on to their new topic of Inheritance and Evolution. Within RE, they will move onto their topic of Reconciliation. Within Maths the children will continue practising their four operations and look at decimals, percentages and fractions to gain even more confidence. On Wednesday of the first week back, Year 6 will enjoy a range of outdoor activities that will replace their residential trip.

Class News – Y5 This half term, as part of their core subjects of study, children in Y5 will be learning

mathematics about decimals, negative numbers, converting units, and measurement volume. These topics will include adding and subtracting decimals with the same and different numbers of decimal places. Multiply and divide decimals by 10, 100, and 1000. Understand, compare, and order negative numbers. Convert between metric and imperial units. Compare and estimate the volume. In English, children will learn how to create and perform a soliloquy, portraying the role of one of Shakespeare's fearless and courageous characters. They will learn to include relative clauses beginning with who, which, where, when, whose, or that. Adverbs will be used to denote degrees of possibility. A greater variety of methods will be employed to create coherence throughout paragraphs. Finally, tense choices will be employed to link ideas. In geography, pupils will be introduced to biomes - Deserts. They will know what biomes are and where hot deserts are, along with their climate and landscape. The ways that flora and fauna have adapted to arid environments. In science, the topic is light. Children will recognise that they need light to see things in the dark in the absence of light. They will learn: to understand that light is reflected from surfaces and recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous and that there are ways to protect their eyes; to recognise that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by an opaque object.

**Class News - Year 3 / 4** We have had a busy few weeks in Years 3 and 4. In DT, the children have been designing and making various wraps. They thoroughly enjoyed eating them despite having an indoor picnic due to the miserable weather we have been having! Photos are on Facebook. The children have been learning about rivers in English and have written formal letters complaining about pollution and sewage. Quite a recent topic in media reports! We have had some great success with the various sporting events that the children have joined in with. Their behaviour has been exemplary during these visits and they should all be very proud of themselves and their achievements. Have a lovely half term holiday and fingers crossed for the weather!

**Class News** – **Year 1/2** Year 1/2 have had a busy, exciting half term. Children have been working hard in phonics with Mrs Andrews in preparation for the Y1 Phonics Screening Test. In English, we have been reading 'The Last Wolf' and completed some fantastic pieces of writing. In DT, children have been designing and making their own puppets. In RE, we have been working hard on our topic, Pentecost and we have just started our new topic, Reconciliation. Just before half term, we had an exciting visit from Pets 4 People who came in to show us lots of different animals including bearded dragons, bunnies and giant snails. We had a great time meeting all of the animals!

**Class News – EYFS** In EYFS we have been learning about lifecycles and this week watched our chrysalis turn into butterflies. We set them free outside and all of the children watched. They have been very gentle around the butterflies and have ensured they had food and water. Our focus text has been The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle and pupils have been retelling the story using props. Nursery children are focusing on numbers to 10 during summer term and will be learning some letter sounds to prepare them for a good start in Reception. Reception children are reading and writing each day so that they are prepared for Year 1. We will be having a big push on our letter and number formation practice when we return after the holidays.



#### **The School Day**

The children need to be in school by 8:55am so that they are ready and in class to start the school day by 9am. The gates to the playground are locked at 8:55am. We would ask that the children do not play on the field or equipment before school, if it has rained the children will end up being wet and muddy for the day.

You will appreciate that we have procedures in place to keep the children safe in school and as they leave the building. If you are not able to pick your child up the school needs to hold details of who is collecting the child, their details and a safe word. Please return the form that has been sent separately.

Children who attend any after school clubs will be brought out onto the playground entrance at the end of a session and the not the front door for safety reasons
