Class News – Y5/6

In Year 5/6 we have been studying an adapted version of Shakespeare's play The Tempest focusing on the use of figurative language to enhance descriptions of settings. We are also well on the way to perfecting this year's Christmas Nativity which we are looking forward to performing. A little reminder that we expect the children to work on Reading Plus twice a week for at least 30 minutes and to use the Arithmetic 16 questions on <u>myminimaths.co.uk</u> to help improve their mental maths skills. We really appreciate your support with their learning. Thank you.

Class News – Y3/4

In Year 3 and 4, we have been practising the songs for out KS2 Nativity performance. The children have been working extremely hard to learn all the words to a new song. We can't wait for you to hear it! In English, we have been learning about Wolves and the class have showcased their knowledge of these amazing animals in a fact file. In Geography, we have been learning how human activity in coastal areas can alter the landscape in a different way and can affect the wildlife living there and cause pollution. In Science, the children tested a range of rocks for hardness, permeability and durability and used their results to choose the most suitable material for a given purpose.

Class News – Year 1/2

In Y1/2 we have started reading Hansel and Gretel. All of the children have worked very hard to retell the story and enjoyed discussing how the characters may have felt at different points in the story. Everybody has worked hard in maths to understand how to subtract numbers with Y1 using number lines and Y2 using column subtraction. Within RE we have discussed how Christians prepare for Advent. Y1/2 cannot wait to perform our Nativity and have enjoyed practising with EYFS. They are very excited to show everybody their fabulous singing and acting!

Class news – Early Years

EYFS have been working hard on their letter sounds and new sight words in Reception and listening to and performing body percussion in Nursery. We have begun our new focus book; The Jolly Christmas Postman, and the children are loving the two new 'winter' seasonal areas to play in, as well as the reading areas which have stick puppets from our book so they can retell the story of the Postman's journey to each other. We have been practising lots for our Nativity with Year1/2 and the children are loving their costumes and the songs they are learning - they are looking forward to all of their parents and carers coming in to watch them perform.





Uniform reminders and a plea

Reminder <u>NO JEWELLERY</u> of any kind is to be worn in school. If your child is having their **ears pierced**, please make sure that this is done at the beginning of the summer holidays so the ears will have time to heal before they come back to school. Any child who ha their ears pierced at the end of the holiday must have their ears covered and all earring should be removed by half term. You can appreciate that this is for health and safety reasons and is part of our school rules.

The children look so smart in their uniform so please remember that they should not wear trainers or hoodies and hair is to be tied up with sensible bobbles and hairbands.

Nail varnish and patterned or shaved hairstyles are also not acceptable and the children should not bring lip balm or lip balm into school. You will appreciate that there are those in school with allergies. Head Lice – please check your child's hair for head lice and treat accordingly.
