## **Class News – Early Years**

In EYFS we have started our new topic of Space and have been reading the book 'Whatever Next' by Jill Murphy. Children have been retelling the story using props and are having fun in the space area with rockets, non fiction books on space and planets and lots of creative activities surrounding space such as cut and stick activities and colouring to develop fine motor skills and playdough mats. Reception made some astronauts with split pins and found out we can join 2 pieces of paper together with the pins to create moving body parts. We are continuing learning about lots of sounds in phonics in Nursery and body percussion as well as beginning to identify initial sounds in 3 letter words. In Reception, we are beginning to learn 2 letters which make 1 sound. In Maths we have done lots of counting out from larger sets, trying to remember the number we need to stop at and in Nursery we are beginning to learn numerals and match them to amounts.

## Class News – Year 1/2

Welcome back Y1 and 2! Every child in Y1 and 2 has returned with a fantastic attitude towards their work. This week, the children have looked at subtraction and chanting our timetables in Maths. In English, the children have all created amazing penguin fact file. We focused on using adjectives to describe. In RE, Y1 and 2 have focused on Local Church. During Science, the children have observed the change in season and discussed what will happen in spring. As a reminder, please make sure your children are reading at least four times a week and that this is recorded in their Home School Diary. Also, they must complete their spelling homework. Our PE Day is a Monday.

## Class News – Y3/4

Year 3/ 4 have welcomed two new children into our class. The children enjoyed their swimming lessons at Mill House. In Science, the children have enjoyed investigating the composition of different soils. They worked in small groups planning and undertaking an investigation to compare the composition of different soils, recording their observations in a labelled diagram. Our class reader this term is The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe and in English, the children will be writing their own portal story.

## Class News – Y5

Welcome back Y5! Every child in Y5 has returned from the Christmas holidays with a fantastic attitude towards their work. This week, the children have looked at multiplication within Maths. They have recognised common multiples, factors and common factors. The children will move on to prime numbers and squared numbers in the next couple of days. In English, the children have all created fantastic diary entries as if they were Michael from our new book 'Kenzuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo. The children have worked hard at using brackets and commas for parenthesis throughout their writing. In RE, Y5 have focused on Other Cultures and have looked at the celebrations of Islam, including Ramadan and Eid-al-Fitr. During Science, the children have continued with their topic of Electricity and have investigated how resistance affects the brightness of a bulb. As a reminder, please make sure your children are reading at least four times a week and that this is recorded in their Home School Diary.




### **Class News – Y6**

Happy 2023 ! It's a new year and a new teacher ! Year 6 have made me very welcome ! There are some changes that I have made, including a new layout to the classroom, and the children are responding very positively. With a little over three months to go before the SATs, it's necessary for us to increase our focus on them. In Maths we have been going over the basics of arithmetic: multiplication, division, addition and subtraction. Whenever the opportunity arises, please let your child have a go at solving these problems in real life eg going shopping and adding up the bill. In English we have begun to look at descriptive writing and improving its accuracy and quality. Using semicolons correctly and persuasive techniques such as rhetorical questions can be very helpful. We have started our new history topic: the Mayans. In RE the children have started to look at the structure of the Catholic Church. In Science we are looking at the effect on increasing voltage on the brightness of a bulb. The children have also been singing in Music and have begun some zentangle-style designs in Art. They have started a weekly mindfulness session with Mrs Andrews and also enjoyed a visit from the Dog Trust! Please help the children develop their reading skills by ensuring that they read at least four times a week and record this in their diary.

#### Uniform reminders and a plea

Just a reminder that as the children return back to school in January that the school policy for that the children should not wear earrings. All long hair should be tied up.

We ask that children wear the correct school uniform and sensible shoes. PE uniform only on PE day.





### **The School Day**

The children need to be in school by 8:55am so that they are ready and in class to start the school day by 9am. The gates to the playground are locked at 8:55am.
