Class News – Early Years

Early Years are continuing our topic 'Let's Grow' in which we are looking at planting flowers and vegetables, talking about weather and seasons, and our focus books are Jack and the Beanstalk and Jasper's Beanstalk. We had a great World Book Day where children made spoons of the Three Little Pigs and they enjoyed retelling stories in our tuff tray areas using props for A Squash and a Squeeze. Reception have begun learning 2 letters making 1 sound in phonics and Nursery are beginning to identify initial letter sounds in words. In maths, Nursery are learning about numbers 1-5 and are doing lots of counting activities. Reception are continuing to develop skills for numbers 1-10 and beginning to identify missing parts for numbers within 5. Children have been planting beans, sunflowers and cress, have been learning about what plants need to grow and predicting what will happen if we take one of those conditions away e.g. no water, no light.

Class News – Year 1

In Y1 we have been working hard, learning all about Antarctica and enjoying the story of 'Ponko and the South Pole'. All of the children sequenced and retold the story in their own words. We finished our shape topic in maths last week and have begun focusing on numbers to 20. We have been using number lines and numicon to help us. Within RE we have looked at all of the special books in Church and their purposes.

Class News – Year 2

Well done Year 2 for an amazing start back into our Spring Term. We have been investigating our new class novel 'The Fire Bird' by figuring out who left the red feathers in our classroom. In mathematics, we have just finished our topic of multiplication and division, and next we will be moving onto fractions. In Science, we have been learning about electricity and what is powered around us. In History, we have been exploring what happened during the Great Fire of London and what caused the great blaze. Keep up the hard work year two! Make sure you are reading at least 3 times a week with your child and asking them questions on the text as it is so important for their learning.

Class News – Y3/4

As Historians, Year 3/ 4 have been learning all about the Roman invasion of Britain and the rebellion of the Celts led by Boudica. In English, we have started exploring 'Escape from Pompeii' by Christina Balit which tells the story of the destruction of Pompeii through the eyes of a Roman Boy, Tranio. The children will be exploring dialogue and writing to create tension when they write diary entries on how they escaped the volcanic eruption. Our geography topic this half term is Angry Earth- Volcanoes and the children have learnt about the structure of the Earth and how volcanoes form. In Science, the children have enjoyed creating models of the digestive system and setting up an experiment to show the effect different drinks have on teeth.

Class News – Y5 Over the past few weeks, Y5 have been reading Kensuke's Kingdom in class. They have written a newspaper article, diary entry, setting descriptions and a narrative about this book and have all extremely enjoyed it. There were a few tears shed at the end of the book! In Maths, Y5 have been focusing on fractions. They have converted improper fractions to mixed number fractions and vice versa; added, subtracted and multiplied fractions. During History, Y5 have learnt all about the Ancient Maya Civilisation and the different way in which the Mayan's lived. During PE, Y5 are learning how to play netball and the skills that go with this. They have began DT and are creating a structure. In French, Y5 are able to describe their family and have translated French into English. During RE, Y5 have learned about the Eucharist as a 'Memorial Sacrifice' and have just begun their Lent topic which is 'Sacrifice'.



Class News – Y6 - With less than two months to go before the SATS, we are now fully immersed in preparing the children for these assessments. The Maths SATs papers test children on arithmetic and reasoning. The SATs papers for English test children on grammar, punctuation, spelling and reading. Children have already completed a full series of papers in class and, overall, I must say that the progress is favourable. In this forthcoming assessment week, Year 6 children across the whole trust will be taking another full set of papers and with this information it will be possible to track children's progress, identity areas of weakness and set individual targets for improvement. This period of time can be stressful and so it is essential to focus on student wellbeing and balance the demands of the curriculum with opportunities for some calm and enjoyment. To this end, the children are working on a whole class presentation of the poem If by Rudyard Kipling which we hope to have ready to perform by the end of the month. Additionally, the children are enjoying our class reader, Private Peaceful by Michael Morpurgo. Morpurgo is renowned for his magical storytelling ability and this book has certainly captivated Year 6, exposing them to a rich and stimulating narrative whilst providing a welcome break from their studies. Please make sure that regular reading is happening at home. I would also be grateful if children could be tested on their multiplication tables whenever the chance arises. It is so important for their fluency in calculation and will serve them well for SATs, secondary school, infinity and beyond. I look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at the forthcoming parents consultation on 21 and 22 March
