# Class News - Y5/6

Recently in Y5/6 the children are coming to the end of their History topic- WW2: The Home Front. They are currently creating a leaflet to describe and explain the different roles civilians had in The Home Front. The children have begun their new topic in Geography - 'Climate Change'. They have looked at how the world's climate has changed over thousands of years using line graphs. The children have continued to use our class book 'Letters from the Lighthouse' to answer comprehension questions. Both Y5 and Y6 have had talks from the school nurse recently about the changes they will experience in their emotions and bodies as they grow older. Our Y6 have started to receive extra tutoring in their math and have extremely enjoyed their lessons so far. The children have begun to learn about the skills they need in Sports Hall Athletics during PE. This week, we have started our new science topic which is Electricity and will be looking at building and understanding circuits.

## Class News - Y3/4

Year 3/4 have been busy this week. They enjoyed a dance session where they pretended to be fireworks. In English, we have been exploring Greek myths and have planned our own myths. In maths, Y4 have been using written methods to add and subtract 4 digit numbers while Y3 have been adding and subtracting a 3 digit number and 1s and 10s. We have also been creating a class blog giving online safety advice.

# Class News - Year 1/2

In Y1/2 we have had a very busy week! We enjoyed racing against each other in our PE lesson and we were lucky enough to have a dance session where we pretended to be fireworks. In Maths, Y1 have focused on using number bonds to 10 and Y2 have started to use column addition. In our English lessons we have changed the story of 'The Rainbow Fish' to include our own creatures and worked hard to improve our descriptions. This week we have also created beautiful firework pictures!

## Class news – Early Years

In EYFS we have been reading Room on the Broom this week and our new focus story is The Gingerbread Man. We have lots of new activities matching our story and have been excited to try these. In phonics Nursery and 2 year olds have focused on Little Red Riding Hood, forest sounds, sounds made by instruments and the initial sounds in words that are the same. Reception phonics has including learning new sight word 'for' and new sounds b, c, g, h, d, e and children have been working hard trying to blend sounds into words. In counting, Nursery have used mathematical language of large and small and have grouped objects, Reception have been counting within 1-7 and have counting objects in a range of ways as well as counting out from a larger set. Karen Liddle School of Dance came in this week and all of the children took part in songs with actions in the hall. Our focus Nursery Rhyme is Dingle Dangle Scarecrow and our RE Topic is Baptism.

## Uniform reminders and a plea

We have a mass a large number of coast, jumpers, cardigans and jackets since the start of term all without names. We will try and match the items with their owners next week but our plea is please label every item with your child's name.

Reminder NO JEWELLERY of any kind is to be worn in school. If your child is having their ears pierced, please make sure that this is done at the beginning of the summer holidays so the ears will have time to heal before they come back to school.
