Special educational needs and disabilities



At St Joseph's Catholic Primary School, we strive to support all children to enable them to achieve their potential. In order to do this, many steps are taken to support them through their learning journey. For some children, there are occasions when additional support may be needed to help them to make the best possible progress in school.

The four broad 'areas of need' are Communication and Interaction, Cognition and Learning, Social, Emotional and Mental Health Difficulties, and Sensory and Physical Needs. We endeavour to identify special educational needs at the earliest possible opportunity so that the child can be given the best and most appropriate support to enable them to access the curriculum.

Parents/ carers will regularly be invited to share their views on their child's needs and progress in order to ensure the most appropriate provision is provided. Children will also be given the opportunity to reflect on their needs and have their views taken into account.

We believe in positive intervention, removing barriers to learning, raising expectations and levels of achievement and working in partnership with other agencies in order to provide a positive educational experience for all our pupils including those with special educational needs or disability.

Children can start school in our reception class in the September of the academic year in which they will be five years old.
