# **October Highlights**

#### First Aid Training-

On Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> October, Year 1 to Year 6 learnt some basic first aid. The children were able to interact, learn and have fun with Flat Stan. Everyone was taught how to move someone into the recovery position and basic CPR.

# **Attendance**

Children are required to be at school by 9am as our core subject lessons (English and Maths) begin immediately after registration.

Appointments should be made out of school time where possible please.

Holidays should be taken outside of term time.

The Department for Education deems that if a child's attendance drops below 90%, they become known as a Persistent Absentee. All absences are monitored thoroughly.

To celebrate great attendance, children with 100% in a week receive 10 dojos on a Friday. The class with the highest percentage will also receive 10 dojos per child.

Below are the percentages of attendance for each class for October:

Matthew (Nursery/Reception) -92%

Mark (Year 1/2) - 95%

Luke (Year 3/4) - 96%

John (Year 5/6) - 94%

The government's target for attendance for primary school pupils is at least 95%.

Our whole school attendance for October was 93.8%.

A child is classed as late if they arrive at school after 9.20am.

0.7% of our pupils arrived late in October.

A child is classed as unauthorised absence is they arrive at school after 9.30am.

2.2% of our pupils had unauthorised absences in October.



# **Uniform**

School uniform promotes a sense of pride in the school and makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance.

If your child is not in correct school uniform, we will ask for correct uniform to be brought in for your child to change into.


Our uniform is:

# **Homework**

Homework reinforces and helps your child to retain information taught in the classroom. It also develops study habits and independent learning.

For Year 1 to Year 6, we kindly ask that your child is listened to reading daily and their reading record is signed. Your child will receive a dojo for each signature in their record.

For Year 1 to Year 6, your child will also receive maths and spelling homework each Friday to be handed back in by the following Thursday.

Times tables are extremely important for children in Year 3 to Year 6. In Year 4, children take a times tables test. Every child has log in details for Times Tables Rockstars - <a href="https://ttrockstars.com/">https://ttrockstars.com/</a> We would greatly appreciate it if your child could regularly practise their times tables at home.

The following hairstyles are not considered appropriate for school:

brightly coloured, dyed hair, headwear with bold patterns or colours, excessive hair accessories.
