

Animal Groups

There are 5 animal groups we look at in Year 1.

Mammal	warm-blooded - give birth to live young - usually have hair or fur - cannot breathe underwater - have lungs to breathe
Fish	cold blooded - have fins and scales - breathe underwater using gills - lay eggs in water - cold-blooded
Bird	warm-blooded - have wings and beaks - have feathers - lay eggs
Reptile	cold-blooded - lay eggs - have scales - cannot breathe underwater
Amphibian	cold-blooded - lay eggs - live on land and water - can breathe - underwater through gills

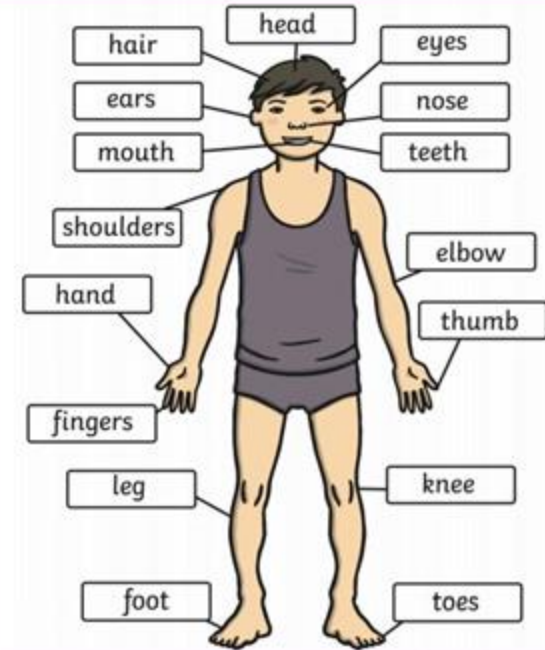
