## This Weeks Reflection

Our Gospel reading is devoted to the words of the Baptist, his words about Jesus. In the 4th Gospel there is no direct description of Jesus' baptism as in the other three Gospels. What we get in today's Gospel is the Baptist's reflection after the event.

But in keeping with the other versions he mentions the two key ideas: the descent of the Spirit and the proclamation that Jesus is the Chosen One of God, though it is he, the Baptist, not the voice from heaven, who makes this proclamation.

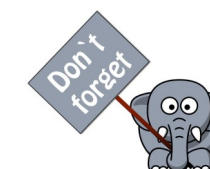
## St John Rigby College – applications for Examination Invigilators
