



## First Sunday of Advent

The Church begins another liturgical year with the season of Advent. The word 'advent' means 'arrival' or 'coming'. There is a threefold coming of Jesus to which the Church draws our attention to: first Jesus' coming as a human being: second, his daily coming into the lives of people; and third, his glorious coming at the end of time. The use of purple vestments underlines the special character of the season.

#### **Nine First Fridays Devotion.**

At St Joseph's we continue with our First Friday Devotion in honour of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. This devotion begs God's infinite mercy for our World and for our Church. he "Great promise" associated with this devotion applied to those who went to Holy Mass and received the Eucharist on **nine consecutive First Fridays:** "I promise you, in the excess of the mercy of My Heart, that its all-powerful love will grant to all those who shall receive Communion on the first Friday of nine consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they shall not die under My displeasure nor without receiving the Sacraments, My Divine Heart becoming their assured refuge at that last hour." We encourage you to join us in begging the Lord for those graces promised through St. Margaret Mary to those who fulfil his directions. by completing the Nine First Fridays devotion.
