# Assisted Suicide Legislation - update

The important vote for all MPs on the assisted suicide legislation, known as the Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill, is likely to take place on 25<sup>th</sup> April.

### N.B The Vote is now taking place on the 16th May 2025

The charity Right to Life UK has a simple online mechanism to allow people to contact their Member of Parliament and it only takes a few moments to submit a message to ask an MP to stop assisted suicide being rushed into law.
