Bill on Assisted Suicide

"It is expected that Kim Leadbeater's Bill on Assisted Suicide will be further debated on 13th June in the House of Commons. I encourage you to ask your parishioners to again contact their MPs and indicate the reasons why we are opposed to the Bill. Many comment from all sides that there has been insufficient debate for such a contentious issue.

The reasons for our opposition are clear; that any means of intending death is immoral, that vulnerable patients may be subject to coercion and pressure, that many healthcare workers will not have a right to conscientious objection and that it threatens the future of Catholic nursing homes and care homes, unless exemptions to the Bill are provided."
