

## This Weeks Reflection

Today's Gospel reading presents the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector. The Pharisee, confident in his own righteousness, boasts about his piety, while the tax collector humbly acknowledgs his sinfulness and pleads for mercy. This contrast highlights that true justification before God comes from humility, not self-righteousness.

In this parable, Luke combines deadly earnestness with humour in a typically Lukan fashion. The pompous and self-contradictory bragging of innocence by the Pharisee is duly repellent, while the humble self-accusation of the tax-collector is something to which we can all aspire
