The government is providing funding to cover one-off universal catch-up premium for 2020 to 2021 academic year. It is to support pupils to catch up for lost learning so schools can meet the curriculum expectations for the next academic year.

At St Joseph's Catholic Primary School, we intend to use a three tiered approach to accelerating catch-up learning for our pupils. This spending plan is based upon the Curriculum Recovery Plan which details how this will be actioned.

The mental, physical and economic impact of COVID-19 has brought about an unpredictable amount of challenges, affecting every family within our school community. This has manifested itself in different ways and therefore it is crucial that, as a school, we re-establish routines and reconnect pupils with their learning. This plan aims to set out how, as a school, we intend to use a three tiered approach to accelerating catch-up learning for our pupils. The main identified significant barriers to education as a result of school closure:

- Gaps in learning as a result of missed education and forgotten learning
- Limited opportunities for children to read, including application of phonic knowledge
