

Parental Involvement at St. Joseph's Catholic Primary School?

At St. Joseph's we value the good rapport, which we have with parents. In addition to the two parents evening which are held twice a year; parents also have the opportunity to meet with class teachers each month for a parent consultation.

We also have an open door policy, which allows parents to come into school to talk at any time throughout the year. The SENDCo (Mrs Baxendale) is also available for parents to discuss concerns by appointment. Induction for new parents takes place in the summer term, parents have a chance to meet their child's class teacher and share any information that they wish. Parents are kept informed of their child's progress against the targets set in their Person-centred Plan at parent's evenings and after reviews of Person-centred Plan. Parents are encouraged to comment on the Person-centred Plan and we endeavour to try to make them part of the review process. Pupils with SEND will be admitted to St Joseph's in line with the school's admissions policy. The school is aware of the statutory requirements related to SEND and disabilities. The school will use its induction meetings to work closely with parents to ascertain whether a child has been identified as having SEND in Early Years Foundation Stage.

If the school is alerted to the fact that a child may have a difficulty in learning they will make their best endeavours to collect all relevant information and plan a relevant differentiated curriculum. Parents contribute and take part in Annual Reviews and receive copies of all relevant paperwork concerning their child. Person-centred Plans are produced termly depending on the circumstance and pupil.
