The Epiphany of The Lord.

The Epiphany originally referred to the self-disclosure of Jesus which took place at his Baptism when the (public side) of his mission began. Later it became associated with the



manifestation of Jesus to the Gentile in the persons of the wise men or Magi in the Western Church, although it retains its original baptismal character in the Orthodox Church. A third event connected with this theme is also associated with today's feast, namely; when Jesus changed water into wine at the wedding feast at Cana as the first signs which would show who he was.


