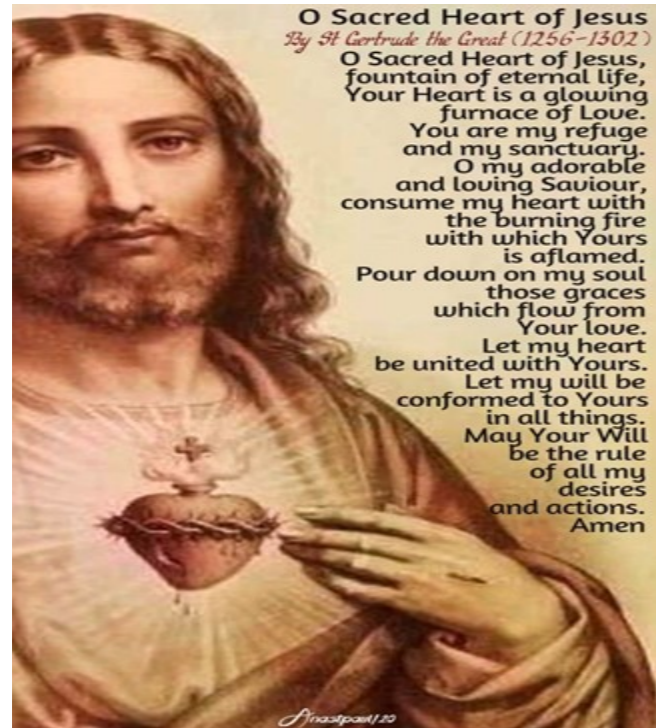
Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

The point of the final section of today's gospel is to make clear that to become a disciple of Jesus does not depend of sex, race, class or creed but it is matter of choice to do the will of the Father.

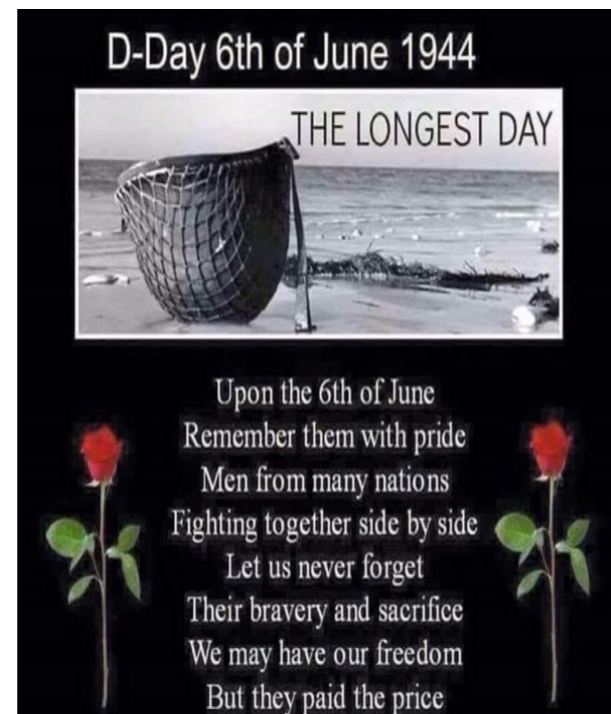


O Sacred Heart of Jesus


