Solemnity of St Peter & St Paul, Apostles.

Peter was a humble fisherman. Paul was a persecutor of Christians. But they were chosen to become pillars of our faith, which they sealed with their martyrdom in Rome.

Monsignor Phil will be presenting an award to Allan Mitchinson and Bob Harvey in recognition for the 50 years of service to the church, as members of the Knights of St Columba at Mass today.

Did you know?

Saint Peter's name was originally Simon and he was a fisherman of Galilee. He was one of the 12 apostles. His brother, Andrew, introduced him to Jesus. Saint Peter struggled with doubt and human weakness, yet Jesus still chose him!

Saint Peter was the first Pope. The Catholic Church can trace the succession of every pope back to Saint Peter! The Acts of the Apostles illustrate his role as the Church's head-the rock upon which Christ would build His Church. He died by crucifixion. Tradition says he requested an upside-down crucifixion because he considered himself unworthy to die the way Jesus did. Saint Peter's Basilica is built over his tomb.

Before receiving the name Paul, he was Saul, a Jewish pharisee who zealously persecuted Christians in Jerusalem.

Saint Paul underwent a huge conversion on his way to persecute Christians in Damascus. He instead went on to be baptized there and dedicated his life to spreading the Gospel.

St Paul was imprisoned and beheaded under Emperor Nero.


