The Eucharistic Prayer is the central prayer of the Mass which is frequently referred to as Eucharist. It is a prayer of thanksgiving, praise, confessing, blessing and acknowledging. It is a Jewish type of prayer and has its origins in the two prayers of thanks which were said over the bread and wine. When he was multiplying the loaves the Lord gave thanks to God his Father. This type of thanks is broader than a simple expression of being grateful. It is what Paul has in mind when he recommends his hearers always to give thanks in psalms, hymns and sacred songs.
