Our Gospel readings today has some harsh dimensions and most likely reflects not the teachings of Jesus directly but the practices in Church for which Matthew was writing. As often in Matthew, however, there is a surprise. People who refuse to acknowledge their failures are to be treated as pagans and tax collectors! But just how are pagans and tax collectors treated by Jesus and in the Gospel of Matthew? Remember the call of Matthew (Mt 9:9)! Recall the story of the Canaanite woman! (Mt 15:21-28)! They are welcomed and forgiven! Any permanent exclusion is to be resisted on the example and teachings of Jesus himself.



CAFOD's food campaign is urging the UK government to protect the right of farmers around the world to use their seeds.
