

<u>Choral Evening Prayer</u> on the Feast of Christ the King - beginning at 3pm, this will be presided by Canon Anthony O'Brien, and feature music by Mozart, Leighton, Howells and Parsons (poster attached).

Latest Pro-Life News: Stop the 14-day limit on experimenting on embryos being removed


