The Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

The first reading on each Sunday is usually connected to the gospel of the day. Sometimes an incident occurring in the gospel is seen to be foreshadowed by an earlier event in the Hebrew Scriptures. At other times they will both contain a similar theme. Sometimes the first reading anticipates the gospel theme. However, it is profitable to find out what the first reading meant in its own day. A second step can then be to see how both readings relate to each other.




